#### **MY PERSONAL STORY**

Steve Smith, NOA Director/Interim Secretary

I have a Urostomy!

First hint of trouble was in the fall of 2017 when I had some blood in my urine. Doctor determined it wasn't an infection and sent me to a urologist. After an ultrasound and blood tests, it was decided to do a CT scan of the abdomen. These showed the need for a cystectomy which showed carcinoma in situ. After many more tests, MRI, bone scan and X-rays, it was decided that a transurethral resection of bladder tumour or (TURBT) was needed to get biopsies.

The TURBT showed pre-cancerous cells in the bladder and BCG treatment was suggested. Before this could be started, they found a tumour on my right kidney that they thought was cancerous and as I had good kidney function, it was decided to remove the kidney - that surgery happened in April of 2018.

About 4 weeks after the kidney surgery which was cancerous, I started BCG treatment with a treatment every week for 6 weeks. Another cystoscopy in July showed new tumours in the bladder that would need another TURBT. This procedure showed Grade 3, Stage T1 aggressive bladder cancer. Another cystoscopy and TURBT late in the fall confirmed previous cancer results and it was not yet muscle invasive but getting close. Chemo and radiation are done only if the cancer is muscle invasive so I elected to have my bladder removed.

Surgery was done in April of 2019 for a radical (Continued on page 6)

cystectomy where the bladder and prostate were removed. I now have an illegal conduit or urostomy.

In the fall of 2019, I elected to attend some meetings of the Niagara Ostomy Association and

joined this group as they had some good speaker presentations and I got some very good tips on how to manage my ostomy.

Also in the fall of 2019, a lump appeared on my neck and after needle and surgical biopsies, it was determined that I had Diffuse Large B Cell Lymphoma. After more bone scans, CTs, bone (Continued on page 8)



marrow tests, lung and heart tests and a PET scan, starting in February of 2020, I underwent a course of 6 chemotherapy treatments, one every 3 weeks which after more scans and testing showed the lymphoma to be gone. I will be followed for 5 years with regular CT scans and bloodwork and discussions with the oncologists with the results of these.

All in all, I had excellent care from my surgeons and nursing staff at Joseph Brant hospital in Burlington where I had my surgeries and from the Oncologists and nursing staff at the Walker Family Cancer Centre in St. Catharines where I went for the chemotherapy.

I am also very supportive of the Bladder Cancer group in Hamilton and the Niagara Ostomy Association for the ongoing support that each group offers. Do you have a story you'd like to share with us for our newsletter? We'd love to hear from you about Life with your Ostomy.

Human urine has been a useful diagnostic tool since the earliest days of medicine. The color, density, and smell of urine can reveal much about the state of our health.

Here is a quick look at some of the things you can tell from the hue of your liquid excreta.

**NO COLOR, TRANSPARENT**: You're drinking a lot of water. You may want to cut back.

**PALE STRAW COLOR:** You're normal, healthy and well hydrated.

TRANSPARENT YELLOW: You're normal.

**DARK YELLOW:** Normal, but drink some water soon.

**AMBER OR HONEY**: Your body isn't getting enough water. Drink some now.

**SYRUP OR BROWN ALE**: You could have liver disease, or severe dehydration. Drink water and see your doctor if it persists.

**PINK TO REDDISH**: Have you eaten beets, blueberries or rhubarb recently? If not, you

may have blood in your urine. It could be nothing, or it could be a sign of kidney disease, tumors, urinary tract infections, prostate problems or something else. Contact your doctor.

**OUTSIDE INFLUENCES**: Stuff you take can change the color of your urine. For instance, some medications, laxatives, chemotherapy drugs and dyes doctors give you to diagnose urinary tract infections can make your urine darker than normal.

FINAL WORD: The Invisible World of Urine: You can tell a lot from looking at your urine. But you can tell a lot more from the kind of urinalysis you should be getting along with a regular physical exam by your doctor. Blood in the urine, a serious sign, is often invisible to the naked eye.

The level of sugars in your urine may indicate a risk for diabetes. When you're at your doctor's office, don't be afraid to pee in the cup. It's one of the best things you can do for your health.

tions (UTIs). You can avoid these by continuously flushing your urinary tract through, by:

Drinking around 2-3 litres of fluids per day (that's around 10-11 large glasses, or 13 mugs of liquid)

Eating foods that are high in Vitamin C - this makes urine acidic and helps prevent infections

Drinking at least two glasses of cranberry juice a day (unless contraindicated)

Why is cranberry juice so useful for urostomates?

Cranberry juice can help avoid urinary tract infections (UTIs) and reduce the amount of mucus that your urostomy produces. If you don't like cranberry juice, you can get cranberry tablets from chemists and health food stores. (NB: don't drink cranberry or grapefruit juice if you are taking warfarin).

Drinking cranberry juice can help reduce the formation of urine crystals in your urostomy if they do form, a cloth dampened with white vinegar dissolves them

There are no particular food restrictions with a urostomy.

Having a urostomy means that you don't have any particular food restrictions, so you can enjoy a normal diet. Some things worth bearing in mind, though, include:

Fish, onions, garlic and asparagus can make your urine smelly

After eating beetroot, your urine (and sometimes your poo) will often be pink.
