Last month I said I was celebrating 14 years with an Ostomy, but I goofed, it's actually 16 years. I never was great at math!

A few days ago I met someone that I had occasional contact with from work; he had suffered from diverticulitis for many years, and told me several times he'd rather die than have a bag. Well, he jumped out of his truck and said, "I'm just like you, look what I've got." He pulled up his shirt and showed me that he has a temporary ostomy. I asked him how he was getting along and he said, not great, I hope they reverse it soon. I talked to

him for a few minutes and tried to coach him a bit, not sure if I helped or not, but at least he decided to get the ostomy. I told him he looked better health-wise, his wife agreed. How common it is for people to not want ostomy surgery. How do we get this to be a non-taboo topic? I guess there's no magic answer.

We are very lucky in this part of the world to have the products available to us to help us lead a normal life with Ostomy. I know it's very difficult for some people to purchase the supplies they need due to the high cost, but I can't imagine how people in some parts of the world that don't even have access to supplies can manage. Most of you know that Friends of Ostomates Worldwide Canada is a charitable organization that I'm involved with. We ship new, unused ostomy supplies to developing countries where ostomy supplies are not

available, at any cost. They simply don't exist. There's quite a history that goes with FOWC dating back more than 30 years. Steve and I will be giving a presentation on FOWC at the April 20th meeting. Please try to attend.

As always, there will be ample time for discussion and questions after the meeting. We are contemplating holding an Ostomy fair day again in the fall. Keep watching for more news as it develops. Anyone that hasn't been to one will find it a very informative day.

MY PERSONAL STORY

NOA Member

As a result of cancer surgery in August of 2019, I found myself with a permanent colostomy. It was quite an adjustment as the surgeons had said they would avoid a colostomy if possible. That's the outcome I had hoped for. However, in order to achieve clear margins they decided to perform a permanent colostomy. Prior to surgery I had 5 weeks of radiation and oral chemo, followed by several months of infused chemotherapy, every two weeks. There was a bit of a break before surgery. A few weeks after surgery, biweekly chemotherapy resumed and finally ended in January of 2020.

Even though I was sent home from Juravinski with a package of ostomy information, I had lots of questions. At the Walker Centre where I went for chemo, I inquired about local services at Hauser's Pharmacy. They were very helpful and

told me about a free Ostomy Fair that was being held in October at the Lion's Club in St. Catharines. I attended, and was amazed at all of the friendly people, helpful information and sample products that I received from the many vendors that had display tables. That's when I decided to join as a member, in order to support the volunteer work the Association does for people living with ostomies in the Niagara Region. Annual membership is only \$30 and can be waived for people with financial need.

Healthy skin. Positive outcomes.

Following the completion of chemotherapy, I had an appointment in March with an NSWOC nurse at Juravinski. And then Covid lockdown hit. The appointment was cancelled. Fortunately, the Niagara Ostomy Association held monthly online meetings that I attended. I quickly learned that it is a safe and confidential place where I am able to talk about my ostomy and learn from the experi-

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

exercise booklets that are available from Conva-Tec, an ostomy supplier. I called them, and they mailed the booklets. As helpful as the booklets are, I still had questions. Through internet searching, I discovered that the woman who authored these booklets is Sarah Russell, a clinical exercise specialist, certified clinical Pilates instructor and cancer rehabilitation instructor. She holds a masters degree in sport and exercise science, and runs a private oncology exercise practice in the U.K. Sarah also has a stoma. Through Sarah's website: https://www.theostomystudio.co.uk/ I purchased classes (roughly \$8 one-time payment each) where I have online access at any time. I also attend live, online classes once a week where I pay weekly. I've gained physical strength and feel reassured knowing that I am exercising safely and effectively. Through Roxie, I learned that Sarah Russell is highly regarded as an expert in the ostomy communities. She presents at conferences throughout the world. Sarah has also written an excellent book, The Bowel Cancer Recovery Toolkit.

My membership in the Niagara Ostomy Association has been a huge benefit. I've met a group of caring people who are here to help! Many thanks! *Happy Member, Niagara Ostomy Association*

1. Do skin wipes make the pouch stick better? No, the wipes that are generally classified as "skin preps" are not adhesives. They are designed to provide a protective layer to the surface of the


skin. This helps to make the removal of adhesives easier on the skin. The use of these types of products may actually decrease the wear time of some extended wear products.

2. <u>Does paste make the pouch stick better?</u> No, paste helps to prevent liquid drainage from getting between the skin and the skin barrier. This protects the peristomal skin and often extends the life of the skin barrier. Paste is NOT an adhe-

sive and too much paste can actually interfere with a good seal.

3. When should skin barrier powder be used? Skin Barrier Powder — such as Stomahesive or Adapt Powder — is used when the peristomal skin is moist due to irritation. When the skin has recovered and healed, the powder should be discontinued. If another type of powder — such as an antifungal powder — has been prescribed, it should be used according to instructions.

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

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

- 4. How often should a pouching system be changed? The answer is "it depends." It depends on many factors such as type of discharge, skin condition, type of skin barrier used, location on the body and construction of the stoma. The key is to achieve predictable wear time. Changing a pouch twice a week is very acceptable.
- 5. What do I need to think about before returning to work? Make sure that you have a release from your physician to return to your job, especially if you do a lot of physical work. It is a good idea to have an emergency kit available at work in case you need to change your pouch.
- 6. Do I need to tell people that I have had ostomy surgery when I return to work? The choice is yours! With a secure ostomy pouching system, nobody needs to know that you have an ostomy unless you want him or her to know. Depending on the situation and your relationship with the person you may wish to share general information about your surgery. Most people are very understanding.
- 7. How often should I empty a pouch? The type of ostomy and the amount of output will influence how often emptying is necessary. You will want to empty your pouch regularly throughout the day usually when it is ½ to ½ full. It is not a good idea to let your pouch overfill.
