

Infections can be caused by obstructions, kidney stones, tumors, cysts, or scar tissues. Almost synonymous with obstruction is infection, and then too often comes stone formation. Once you have stone formation, it's hard to get rid of the infection. It's a kind of a cycle that goes around and around.

Infection can be caused by urine being forced back to the kidneys through the conduit. This could happen if you fall asleep with the pouch full of urine and accidentally roll over on the pouch, causing urine to be forced back through the stoma and the urinary tract with tremendous pressure. Invariably, the urine in the pouch is contaminated.

In general, to prevent and treat infection, you need a good flow of urine, much like a stream. That not only dilutes the bacteria or germs in the urine but also helps wash them out. Two and onehalf liters (quarts) of liquids daily are required for the average adult. Also, antibiotic therapy is used to fight infection.

Night drainage is recommended. Otherwise, you run the risk of urine backing up into the kidneys which can cause irritation or infection. This is especially important for urostomates with only one kidney.

It's important to be aware of the symptoms of a kidney infection: elevated temperature, chills, low back pain, cloudy urine, or decreased urine output. People with ileal conduits normally produce mucus threads in their urine which give a cloudy appearance, but bloody urine is a danger sign.

You must see your doctor if any of these symptoms occur.

CONVEXITY CREATES SOLUTIONS AND RISKS

Ostomy skin barriers formed with convexity provide great relief by securing the appliance a bit more "deeply" around a stoma surrounded by skin con-



tours. Some even use belts to increase the effect.

Convexity can create issues as well, said Rhonda Souchek, RN BSN CWOCN of CHI Health during a February Lincoln Ostomy Association meeting.

"We've learned to recognize the appearance of skin irritation and adjust," she said. "We see people fitted

with too much convexity could get pressure ulcers. I always say a great fit takes some time and talking. It takes learning and adjusting."

On the other hand, convexity can greatly improve problems with uneven skin and unusual stoma construction.

"I think convexity is a great tool for improving fit," Souchek said. "Pressure ulcers are rare, but we know the causes and how to treat them."

Souchek also discussed the importance of the skin barrier opening, especially regarding convexity. An incorrect size may cause cuts to the stoma.

"If your barrier is the exact same size as your stoma, it could rub and cut you and you would never feel it," she said. "We recommend you open the hole at least 1/8 inch [3 mm] larger than the base of your stoma. An ostomy nurse helps with measurements."

Souchek said a WOCN can help navigate surrounding dips, creases, and folds and present the best product options. She said assessment of the stoma and skin should be done while sitting, and not when lying down. Fitting also involves twisting side-to -side, lifting legs, leaning forward, etc.
