

This is especially important since the Niagara Region is underserviced in terms of specialized care. I have been involved for almost 5 years and it's amazing to me that anyone can access NOA services, free of charge. These include:

- Website and social media
- Monthly meetings / networking with guest speakers – often service providers
- Monthly newsletter
- Annual ostomy health fair

- PSW orientation to various types of ostomies
- Supporting the annual Ostomy Youth Camp by helping to sponsor youth attendance at the camp. Youth Camp is a program offered through Ostomy Canada Society
- Our Friendly Visitor program matches trained NOA members to the caller's needs; initially with a phone call and possibly with one or more inperson visits. Our visitors have been trained by Ostomy Canada Society. Friendly visitors do not provide medical assistance. Rather, they provide emotional and practical support.
- Ask the NSWOC a highly valued service provided by Board member Roxie Demers, RN
  NSWOC (Nurse specialized in Wound Ostomy
  and Continence). She has been on our board and
  in this role for 3+ years.
- Affiliation with and support of our national organization, Ostomy Canada Society

NOA membership is available at the affordable price of \$30 / calendar year and helps fund the incidental expenses

of the above activities: primarily meeting costs, insurance, occasional printing / postage and helping to sponsor attendance at Youth Camp for a local youth living with an ostomy.

### PETITION: URGING ADP TO HONOUR 75% REIMBURSEMENT FOR OSTOMY SUPPLIES

The Ostomy Canada Society is leading a crucial petition for the Assistive Devices Program (ADP) in Ontario to recognize and adjust for the rising costs of ostomy supplies. Join us in urging ADP to honour its commitment to reimburse 75% of these expenses. Sign the petition today to support the dignity and well-being of persons living with an ostomy in Ontario.

In the heart of every community, there's a pulse, a steady rhythm that is the collective heartbeat of its people — a community that celebrates triumphs and faces challenges head-on. # The Unheard Struggle of Persons Living With An Ostomy

Medical supplies are not a luxury but a necessity for Ontarians living with an ostomy. These devices allow them to lead active, productive lives following surgery or other significant medical procedures. However, since 2016, ostomy patients in our province have shouldered an increasing financial burden due to stagnant support from the ADP, which has not adjusted for inflation's impact on the cost of essential supplies.

#### An Appeal for Compassion and Action

Join the Ostomy Canada Society in petitioning the Legislative Assembly of Ontario:

"Respect the Assistive Devices Program's mandate to reimburse 75% of the average cost of ostomy supplies and immediately meet the funding commitments to Ontarians requiring ostomy supplies."

The Health Critic for the official opposition has agreed to present the petition while in session. This way, the Government is required to respond within 24 working days. Making this change isn't just about adjusting a budget line; it's about doing what's right for our neighbours, friends, and families affected by this issue. It's a testament to the values of Ontarians — values that ensure everyone has access to the care and resources they need.

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




