

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# WHY IS MY STOMA BLEEDING BRIGHT RED BLOOD? IT COULD BE DUETO GRANULOMAS

"Help! I need to see the Ostomy Nurse right away! My stoma keeps bleeding!" A very common reason why ostomates make appointments with their WOCN (Wound, Ostomy and Continence Nurse) is for "bleeding stomas." Ostomates describe bright red blood when they clean their stoma with their routine pouch changes. This can be especially concerning for ostomates who are on blood thinners and have difficulty getting the bleeding to stop. People may or may not notice a little bit of blood in their stoma bag from time to time. This could be due to granulomas. Granulomas are small, red, raised areas on or around the stoma. They develop as a result of over-healing of damaged skin on the stoma surface, possibly due to friction from the bag. Some, but not all, stoma

granulomas can cause bleeding and discomfort. Also, if they are large, they may prevent pouch adhesion, which may result in leakage problems.

Even before your WOCN performs the pouch change and assessment with you, they may ask you a few questions that will help shed light on the problem, such as:

• Do you notice any raised bumps around the stoma that almost look like little red buds?

• Have you been measuring your opening in the pouch bigger lately?

• Do you typically use a barrier ring?

• Do you use a stoma belt?

Once the pouch is removed, your WOCN will inspect the back of the flange to see if a barrier ring is being used and if there is the presence of bowel movement caked on the back of the flange. They will assess for typical appearance of granulomas around your stoma. Granulomas are not considered dangerous and are usually easy to

treat with some modifications to your pouching system and the assistance of a stick-like device called Silver Nitrate (AgNO3).

Here are the steps:

1. The WOCN will measure your stoma for your pouching system, and include only the stoma in



the measurement, not the granulomas.


2. The WOCN will discuss a barrier ring that you can place directly around the cut opening created in the flange/pouch to get a good seal around the stoma and prevent bowel movement from creeping onto healthy skin around the stoma, which

can cause inflammation and granulomas to appear. A mild convexity pouch or flange may be suggested, which will apply mild pressure to help flatten the granulomas.

3. The WOCN will use the Silver Nitrate stick to roll or dab over the granulomas and underneath the root.

4. After the pouch is applied, ensure you get a good seal by applying pressure for at least 90 seconds. Wearing a stoma belt (if your pouch has belt tabs) will help provide closer contact to your skin and also support the weight of



your pouch. You may need to change your pouch more often so that the Silver Nitrate can be applied regularly and reduce the granulomas faster. Once the granulomas are reduced, you usually can go back to your normal change schedule.
